Curated by House of Taswir and Associates. In collaboration with Addar Istanbul and the Forbidden Museum in Ramallah. With the participation of over 40 artists from the Gaza Biennale and international artists friends.

**GAZA BIENNALE – THE ISTANBUL PAVILION** features the work of over 50 artists from Gaza, Palestine, and beyond. The exhibition unfolds across two floors of Depo Istanbul during the 18th International Istanbul Biennial and is curated by House of Taswir in collaboration with the artists of the Gaza Biennale.

In 2024, in a breathtaking act of artistic defiance—and in collaboration with the Forbidden Museum of Al Risan mountain near Ramallah—artists in Gaza launched the Gaza Biennale from a beach under siege. Since then, art institutions worldwide have begun hosting Gaza Biennale Pavilions—acts of diasporic solidarity that replace national representations with a transnational practice of artistic affinity and alliance.

House of Taswir is honored to host The Istanbul Pavilion at Depo Istanbul in close collaboration with artists who live and work in Gaza. Due to the ongoing genocidal war, the forced famine and closed borders devastating Gaza and Palestine, most Gazan artists are unable to travel, and their works cannot physically cross borders. In response, the Istanbul Pavilion—together with the artists—re-imagines exhibition practices through co-creation, ghost-writing, tele-conversations, and collaborative installations.

Since its inception, in gestures of overwhelming generosities, more than twenty international artists have joined the Gaza Biennale Istanbul Pavilion by donating works in support of the artists. We are proud to show works by Alfredo Jaar, Walid Raad, Shirin Neshat, Elisabeth Masé, Silvina Der Meguerditchian, Furkan Akhan, Khaled Tanji, Ghayath Almadhoun, Christine Gedeon, Michael Barenboim, and more.

Featured formats include video portraits, mobile phone dialogues, wall writings, a table of scholars, a poetry festival, and the emergence of a Museum of Affinities and of Distant Collaborations. A performance program of film screenings, poetry evenings, and in-situ conversation with the Gazan artists will be held during the entire seven weeks of the Biennale.

### **Declaration of the artists**

We hereby announce from here, from the land of Gaza, the launch of the **Gaza Biennale**, with the participation of over 40 artists, to affirm that Palestinian art pierces through all besieged spaces. No war can stop the dreams of dreamers, and no mechanisms of domination extinguish the light in the hearts and minds of creators. On behalf of all the participating artists, including those who, due to war and geographical division, are unable to join us physically, we affirm the following:

- 1. Through art, we resist all forms of genocide and oppression.
- 2. We continue to give and create, despite all obstacles and challenges.
- 3. Through art, we transcend barriers, ensuring that the voices of Palestinian artists reach the world, reaffirming Palestinians' right to speak and be heard.
- 4. The Biennale represents the starting point for collective artistic work, uniting many parties and institutions that believe in the justice of our cause and the power of art.
- 5. The Biennale emerged despite dispersion, displacement, and suffering endured by artists, gathering to fill a need—for invention, dignity and purpose, we present a vision for a better future.

This Biennale is a call to the world, to artists and cultural institutions, to stand in solidarity with Palestinian artists, support them, and work together to ensure that their voices and stories remain present, and that their works remain a testament to struggle and resilience, lighting a path for humanity in the most dire times.

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




